WARDEN'S MESSAGE

As we begin to see the signs of summer, we realize how beautiful our Municipality really is. Many groups have recently been involved in roadside cleanups, I'd like to thank them for making our communities a better place. Litter along our roads continues to be an issue; I urge all of you to properly dispose of your waste, to keep our area looking its best.

Once again, the story of our medical clinic has been in the news. The plan had suggested that construction would begin in August; however, the latest review suggested the roof structure was not sufficient. Therefore, a new plan requiring more funding is necessary. I have spoken with the Minister of Health and expressed our frustration and he assured me that he and the Premier remain fully committed to a new clinic and will do his best to have Provincial staff expedite the process to minimize further delays. He understands the importance of the new medical clinic to the availability of doctors for our citizens and our long term economic sustainability. I will continue to work towards maintaining the forecasted opening date of June 2017.

Property tax bills have recently been sent out and some residents are concerned with the amount of taxes they have to pay. It is important to note that approximately 40% of the taxes collected by the Municipality go directly to the Province for non-discretionary expenditures such as policing, education, etc. Our Council will continue to do its best to keep taxes as low as possible.

Most people are aware of the Tax CAP Program that the Province put in place when the tax assessment was increasing substantially on some properties through inflation. There are now less benefits to residents from this program than when it began. Government officials have recognized that it is no longer working in a fair manner, but because of the program's popularity, have been reluctant to fix the problem. For example, two identical houses next door to each other are capped, one house sells and the capped value gets reset. Now, you have one neighbor paying substantially more taxes than the other. This can be fixed. You can make a difference by voicing your concerns to your Provincial politician.

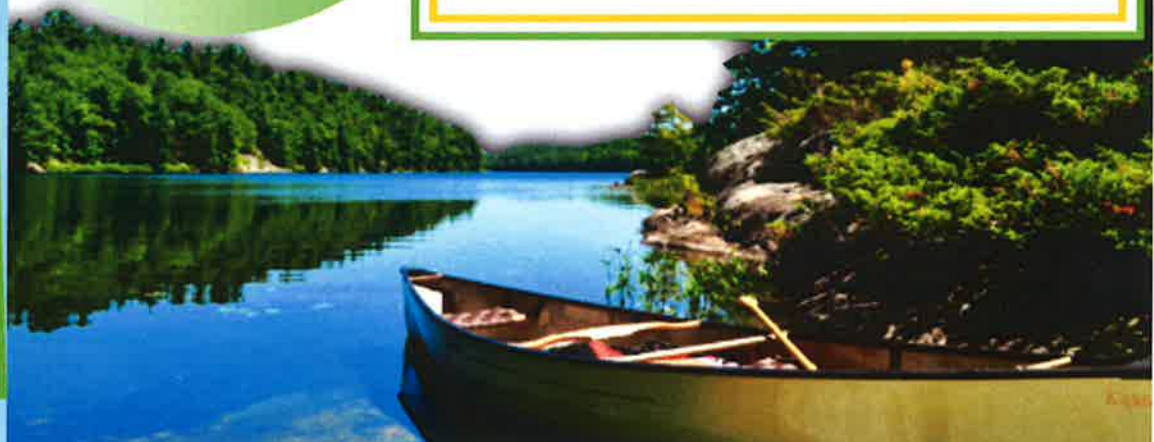
The Municipality's Heritage Advisory Committee and the Shelburne County East RCMP Advisory Board are looking for members of the public who may be interested in becoming representatives.

INSPECTION SERVICES

ARE EMERGENCY SERVICE PROVIDERS HAVING TROUBLE FINDING YOU?

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Don't wait until an emergency happens. Post your civic number at the end of your driveway. Make sure it is made of reflective material and visible from both directions.

The Municipality's Civic Addressing By-Law states that:

(1) The owner of a property shall keep posted on the property the assigned civic number.

TAX & FINANCE

LOW INCOME PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION

Pursuant to Section 69 of the Municipal Government Act, the Municipality is granting a tax exemption of up to \$300. The exemption is granted only in respect to property occupied by the ratepayer as his or her home and whose total income from all sources for 2015 (including income of all other persons residing in the household) is \$20,000 or less.

Send in or drop off an application with a copy of your 2015 Notice of Assessment from Revenue Canada to the Finance Department. For more information, please contact the Finance Department at 902-875-3544 ext. 222 or 228. Applications must be filed by **August 31**.

NOT RECEIVING YOUR TAX BILL?

If your property tax bill does not have the correct mailing address as specified by your postal carrier, it may not be delivered to you. Please ensure we have the correct mailing address on file for all your properties within the Municipality of Shelburne.

If you need help determining your correct mailing address, please contact your postal carrier.

ASSESSMENT

While the Tax Office uses property assessments to calculate taxes, we are unable to provide information on assessment related inquiries. Please contact Property Valuation Services Corporation (PVSC) with any assessment questions or concerns at 1-800-380-7775 or visit www.pvsc.ca.

BE PREPARED & STAY SAFE

With the terrible tragedy that has taken place in Alberta recently with the huge fires and community evacuations, we can see how well-organized emergency response unfolds. Now is the time that we, locally, can learn to prepare ourselves if the need for mass evacuation ever arises. It is recommended that we have on hand enough supplies (food, water, medication) to last a minimum of 72 hours. You should also have a "Go Bag" containing, at a minimum, a flashlight, a small battery powered radio, a multi-tool (a combination knife, pliers, screw driver, etc.), a change of clothes, matches in a waterproof container, feminine and personal hygiene items and copies of personal documents (identification, bank records, insurance policies, etc.)

SCEEMO is currently looking into ways to incorporate pet care during evacuations.

We can never know when disaster might strike and the ability to leave quickly and efficiently will help to ensure you and your family are safe.

TAX SALE POLICY

The Municipality has recently approved a Tax Sale Policy which states "Property shall be sold for tax sale if taxes are in arrears for the preceding *two* fiscal years".

A preliminary notice will be sent in July, advising that the property is liable to be sold and that tax sale procedures will commence unless the arrears are paid in full within 14 days of that notice.

Backyard composting in 10 easy steps:

1. Choose a flat, partly sunny area with good drainage.
2. Find yourself a bin. Inquire with your Municipality or Town, or build your own.
3. Create a 6-10 cm base layer using dried leaves, straw, woody materials.
4. Alternate layers of green and brown materials. Chopping up large materials will aid in faster decomposition.
5. Whenever you add a food scrap layer, top it off with a layer of brown material (dried leaves, straw, woody materials).
6. Mix bin contents every week or two. This aerates materials to get them heating up and decomposing faster.
7. Moisture content should be like a wrung-out dishcloth.
8. The pile will shrink, while you continue to add more layers.
9. Your compost is usually ready within 2-3 months, but aging for 1 or 2 more is advised.
10. Harvest your compost from the bottom of the pile and add it to your garden, or share with friends and neighbors to reap the rewards of all your hard work.

ILLEGAL DUMPING FIVE FINES ISSUED - MORE CASES PENDING

In an effort to decrease illegal dumping of solid waste in our Municipality, By-Law Enforcement staff have been busy identifying those responsible for illegally dumping their waste on other people's property.

Five people have recently appeared in Shelburne Provincial Court and each received \$500 fines. The fine range according to our by-law is \$500-\$5,000. There are currently three additional cases pending court proceedings.

Unfortunately, there are people who will load their vehicle with waste and look for a side road or woodlot road where they can dump it. If you have a road that leads to your property you may want to consider restricting access; a little prevention is better than having to clean up someone else's waste.

Illegal dumping is totally unnecessary and senseless. The Municipality offers a waste disposal stream for every type of material. Our Waste Diversion Coordinator can answer any questions about waste disposal. A side road or the woods is never an option.
